Today, **\*\*Congressman Mark DeSaulnier (CA-10)** announced that he advanced 15 projects for consideration by the U.S. House Committee on Appropriations that total over \$30.5 million in Contra Costa and Alameda Counties as part of the Fiscal Year 2024 appropriations process\*\*. The projects selected would help to address homelessness and the high cost of living, improve transportation systems and infrastructure, bolster public safety, protect the environment, and expand access to quality education. Each year Congress provides Member-directed federal funding to a select number of Community Projects through the appropriations process. Under this process, each House member is allowed to submit 15 project requests on behalf of their Congressional District to the Appropriations Committee that meet the criteria set forth by the Committee.

Transportation and Infrastructure Projects:

**\*\*\$2,000,000 for the San Ramon Intelligent Transportation System and Citywide Communications Infrastructure Project to build out a publicly-owned, citywide fiber optic network for use by businesses and residences, as well as smart traffic signals, city facilities, and license plate reader cameras\*\***
